Like many CFALA members, Andy Chong has found being a charter holder very beneficial to his career. Our May volunteer of the month now helps others who want to achieve that distinction.

Chong received his CFA designation and joined the society in 2007. Since then, he's served as a coordinator for the CFA exam review program at the University of Southern California and mentor to current CFA candidates. He is also Co-Chair of the Asian Pacific community of interest group, one of the biggest and fastest growing communities within

the society.

"I enjoy giving back, and volunteering is very helpful in terms of personal and career development, learning to network with different people and how to organize different events," Chong said.
