Giving is what motivates Anthony Diaz, who does a lot of it both in his career and in his volunteer work with CFALA. His generosity – and hard work – have made him January's Volunteer of the Month.

A member for over 10 years and a CFA charter holder since 2007, Diaz has been a Level One coordinator for the USC/CFALA CFA Review Program for almost five years. He's also a Level 1 mentor, a member of the Board of Governors, and has twice served as a panelist at the annual Career Expo.

"Volunteering gives me the opportunity to interact with other members of the society and the opportunity to give back," Diaz said.

Diaz spent nine years in Air Force after high school, then worked in marketing research before deciding to go back to college. He is now an assistant portfolio officer at BNY Mellon in Century City.
